Evening in Paris

On September 13, Wheaton alums and current students gathered at the School of the Museum of Fine Arts for a reception and a lecture by Professor R. Tripp Evans about the MFA exhibit "Americans in Paris." His marvelous talk recounted the time from 1860 to 1900 when many American painters traveled to Paris, then the capital of the western art world, either to enroll in art schools or to establish their artistic reputations. With his humorous and insightful lecture, the audience was able to view the exhibit with that much more knowledge of the artwork and the artists that created the pieces. The very romantic show, included the works of James McNeill Whistler, John Singer Sargent, Winslow Homer, and Mary Cassatt.
